1. **Adversity** – A difficult or challenging situation.
    - *Example:* Maggie faced great adversity in her journey to becoming a professional boxer.
  2. **Tenacity** – Persistent determination.

22. **Melancholy** – Deep sadness, often without a clear reason.

23. **Despondent** – Feeling hopeless or discouraged.
